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BLANKETS FOR MOMS IN PRISON

God opens another door in the ministry of Threads of Love, again saying silently, 'I care about you, you are important because you are one of my children and I love you.' When this ministry started almost ten years ago, I had no idea where God would lead us. He has used Threads of Love in reaching out to so many different people in so many different ways. Through our love of sewing, we have touched the lives of so many families. It may have been in the loss an infant, a premature baby, showing young children the important of making Lovie dolls and then praying for those babies, or giving home bound adults something to fill their time and fill needs. I know there are so many other ways that we don't even know about.

Now Threads of Love is reaching out into women's prisons and touching their lives with our stitches of love. How can this be? In November of last year I was put in touch with a chaplain named Alex Cruz who works at a prison for women in Robstown, TX. He had the vision of how we could reach out to the young women. Alex told me that some of these young girls are pregnant at the time they are booked into the prison. In talking with Alex, he shared with me how so many of these girls come from a background where no one is never nice to them without strings attached to their action. After hearing his story I agreed that we would be more than delighted to help in showing the love of Jesus through our sewing. We decide to send blankets for him to have on hand so when these young mothers delivered their babies, he could give them a blanket and a prayer from us showing Jesus love.

Once again God met our needs , but in ways that showed me that this was in His will. Alex said he would need about twenty-five blankets a year. We agreed that the Baton Rouge chapter of Threads of Love would make these blankets at our January workshop. The December workshop was already filled with other projects for Christmas. Upon getting ready for that meeting, I began to pull out all the knitted and crocheted blankets that had been saved all year long to be used as Christmas gifts for the babies in the NICU unit. While gathering these blankets together in my sewing room, I came across a stack of seventeen blankets that I had put up because they were much to big for our preemie babies. A few days later I received a box containing caps and booties that were too big for our preemies also. I just gave thanks to the Lord for finding this wonderful forgotten treasure. In the meantime I called Carol Miller in Alabama, one of the other chapters, to write a prayer for these mothers and their babies. I must say that she has done an excellent job with the two prayers that are to go with this new project. Thanks Carol! **(continued on Page 2)**

From Katie Fontenot—Sulphur Threads of Love

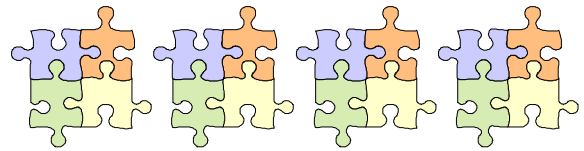

Needless to say her birth was met with mixed emotions - Overjoyed that finally I had a baby, but very uneasy due to her premature condition. Seeing all of the tubes and wires attached to her little fragile, unclothed body was overwhelming. It all seemed unreal, and so did the baby. One day, on one of my countless visits to the NICU at Woman's Hospital in Baton Rouge, I noticed a neatly placed packet that contained a small cap, a gown, a blanket, and a prayer; all with *Threads of Love* on them. I was so excited to finally get some clothes that fit my baby! She finally seemed like a real baby to me. Those items will remain keepsakes. I had every intention of trying to find an address to contact you, but as you get home with the baby and try to get settled in, before you know it a year has passed, then two, etc. But I heard mention of *Threads of Love* name concerning taking responsibility for the burial of an abandoned baby and that brought to mind the unselfish act of kindness you were showing, bur also that same kindness that you had shown to me and my baby. I am forever grateful and I want you to know that this ministry is truly a ministry of Love. Although you may not always be acknowledged, you are touching and blessing the lives of many. 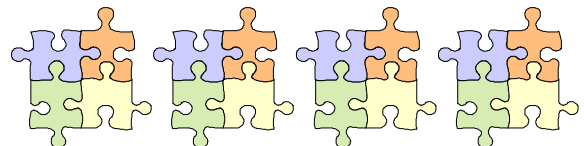

We have a member of our chapter, Kim Phillips, who is a nurse in the NICU, and she has told us that they use the lovie dolls to lift the babies' shoulders and prop their legs and arms in different positions. We make the Lovies in the smallest size socks as well as the toddler size, and the nurses love them for the tiny ones. I had never thought about it, but the lovies are a perfect "pillow" for weensie little babies. I will ask Kim what she thinks of the bean bag idea. She also has us making little sheets for the isolettes and they love them too. One yard of 42 inch (or whatever size near that the fabric comes) hemmed makes a perfect sheet. I was at the hospital today, and they were using several that we have made for them. Kim is such a blessing to us, she gives us feedback and updates us on what is needed. She was so cute when she gave us the measurements for the sheets. I asked her to measure the little mattresses, and at our next meeting she spoke to all of us and showed us the little blood pressure cuffs and little preemie diapers and teensy pacifiers and all sorts of things that they used for the babies. Then she boldly announced that the mattress measurements were 60 x 75, and we needed to add some to tuck under them. All of us looked at each other and couldn't believe what we heard. I asked if she was sure, and she looked at her notes and said that was correct. I said, "Kim, that would be almost as large as a twin bed." She looked really puzzled and then said really loudly "CENTIMETERS! We measure everything in centimeters.". We just laughed. She said "How on earth can we change that to inches?" I told her not to worry, that measuring tapes had both types of measurements, so we found that they were much smaller than we thought. We have so much fun, and are always saying "If it is this much fun, does it still count?" I won't be able to come to the convention, but I would love to. I am sure it will be wonderful. I hope many good things come from it.
