





JULY DEVOTIONAL

"You will guard him and keep him in perfect and constant peace whose mind (both its inclination and its character) is stayed on You, leans on You, and hopes confidently in You. So trust in the Lord (commit yourself to Him, lean on Him, hope confidently in Him) forever; for the Lord God is an everlasting Rock (the Rock of Ages)" Isaiah 26:3-4 (Amplified Bible).

What precious words we have to meditate on today in the Book of Isaiah...are you in need of that "perfect and constant peace" today? I know I am...almost everyday! Our mind's inclination is to be distracted by the noises of daily life, and schedules, and commitments, and lists, and....it goes on and on what our minds can be drawn to. But what does the Scripture say about our minds that STAY on, and LEAN on, and HOPE confidently in our God and His Word? It says that the Lord will guard us, and keep us in perfect and constant peace when we turn our minds on HIS everlasting love, and comfort, and strength. This Word today reminds us that He is an EVERLASTING Rock....a strong arm to lean on when we are weak, or heart-broken, or undecided, or disappointed. We love to admire the huge rocks we see as we travel through hills where the rocks are exposed to make a road for us to travel on....that view makes me think of our ROCK of AGES...the foundation of our faith and hope.

This thought continues in Colossians 2:8-9: "See to it that no one carries you off as spoil or makes you yourselves captive by his so-called philosophy and intellectualism and vain deceit (idle fancies and plain nonsense), following human tradition (men's ideas of the material rather than the spiritual world), just crude notions following the rudimentary and elemental teachings of the universe and disregarding the teachings of Christ (the Messiah)....For in HIM the whole fullness of Deity (the Godhead) continues to dwell in bodily form (giving complete expression of the divine nature)."

Let's focus on our Everlasting Rock of Ages today, and keep our minds in that perfect peace we so desperately crave today!
