Our fruit are the clothes that we donate to babies who are in need. Threads of Love has produce much fruit, since September 1997 we have donated 610,000 items to hospitals across the US and Canada. I am happy to announce that in August we signed our first chapter in England.

As long as we keep our eyes on Christ and let God be our CEO, Threads of Love will continue to produce much fruit. Let's not ask what I can do for God but depend on Him, and continue to be His servant we will produce much fruit with our little clothes. The following is an example of what can happen when you believe and just let God be in charge.

I have been blessed in countless ways by being a part of this wonderful ministry. I began this journey in San Antonio and I was so inspired by Liz Page, a wonderful model of Christian faith, leadership and joy, as well as my former Chapter Leader Mannes Bumstead. After I moved to Austin, I felt the call to start a chapter in my area and with much encouragement from Sissy and prayerful consideration I made my commitment and started the North Austin Chapter. I had no idea how it would go but I was committed to serve the Lord and give it my best. Of course I made all kinds of mistakes but learned from each and every one.

The greatest thing I learned came about when I had the opportunity to attend the Texas Threads of Love Convention in the Spring of 2005. Sissy had a session on starting a chapter and of course I knew I needed that one. She said "do not do fund raisers. Turn the fund raising over to God and go do your sewing, knitting or crochet or whatever you do". I was stunned, as I had elaborate plans for raising funds to get the sewing room that we had just been provided at my church parish hall fully equipped. So I went on with a prayer campaign instead, and ask for prayers about the equipment for the sewing room instead of raising funds. Several sewing machines were donated and other items began to come in. Over and over I said as I stitched "The Lord will provide" and I believed that. Shortly, I received an email about a grant that was available for startup of outreach ministries to women and children. We met the criteria and I had 15 days to get the application and all supporting documents together. I was told there were at least twenty five applicants and only 10 grants would be awarded. Some were for \$500 and some for \$1000. I boldly requested \$1000. And I prayed... Forty days later I received a call that we were awarded the grant. I was so thankful to God. I called my Volunteer Coordinator at the hospital we serve and left a message. She returned my call and I said I had great news to share, and she said "Wait! I have a surprise for you first. The Hospital Auxiliary has donated \$1200, for your chapter to buy a heavy duty serger and supplies for the sewing room." I was so overwhelmed I could not believe we were getting our sewing room fully equipped.

That was last year. As I turned in my end of year report in July, my volunteer coordinator ask for some examples of the things we make to show the Hospital Auxiliary. I dropped them off for her and she called a few days later and said to please come by and pick up the samples. The Auxiliary was very

They had taken pictures of Johnathon with the memory items; it made them all the more special.

We were so touched by this kind gesture that we decided to use our experience to bless others just as the kind people had put much love and time into the items that they hand made and placed in that beautiful memory box that still has a special place in our home and our hearts.

We started up this chapter in August, '04 and God has quickly put us to His work. We serve the North Central Baptist Hospital, in San Antonio, Texas which just recently grown from a regular nursery with an 8 bed special care nursery, to a 26 bed level 3 NICU and is expandable by 36 more beds, when the need arises. I'm pleased to say God has blessed our chapter with lovely ladies who have served and have our NICU fully stocked when the doors opened July 17th, 2006. God is so good, and worthy to be praised. 
