Knowing the families that receive each gift of love, whether it's a loss of their precious babies or the uncertainty of the outcome of their tiny premature infants, they also received that warm fuzzy feeling that someone they didn't even know cared enough to make and give them tiny clothes to dress their precious angel in. In turn, you should also be feeling that warm love, along with our Lord and Savior as He looks down on how those stitches of love touches all the different hearts. Not only the Threads of Love volunteers and the parents of the tiny babies, but the staff and nurses at all the hospitals across this country that we call the home of the free, also feel that warmth of giving kindness.

Most of you know that our definition of an infant is up to one year old. After talking with a nurse from another hospital and learning of their needs, I took her request to our board to supply larger blankets for older children. The board felt that with this was an area that we should minister to and therefore not stand by our limit of one year. Her specific request was for blankets to give to those children that where brought in to the Emergency Room that needed to be examined for sexual abuse; that month alone, there had been 18 children ranging in ages of two months to twelve years old. I would hope that all of you would talk with your hospital to see if there is a need there also. These are little hearts that not only need to be mended, but need love and kindness right then and there. What a horrible thing for a child to have to face in a secular world. Let's put the definition of and infant aside and meet this need head on. You can contact me for the prayer that has been written for this ministry if you decide to take this on as part of your outreach.

Simply Call Her Mom

Have trouble making tiny gathers? Here's the method that I use, it works great! I use a stitch length of 2, lower



the top tension 2 numbers. You will need to play with getting the right stitch length and tension setting with your brand of machine, I have a Viking.

Stitch gathering rows in place with the right side up. That puts the bobbin thread on the wrong side of the fabric. When gathering, always pull the bobbin thread! Pulling the top thread locks the stitch. If two rows of gathering are used (which I prefer), pull both the bobbin threads at the same time. Now, you will have dainty heirloom gathers instead of monster gathers.
