We sure could use some of those April Showers in California.

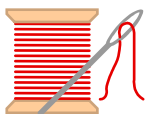

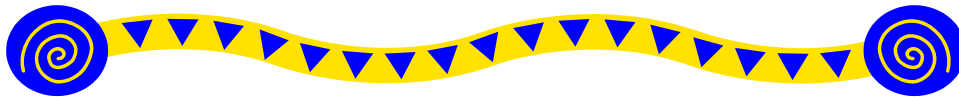

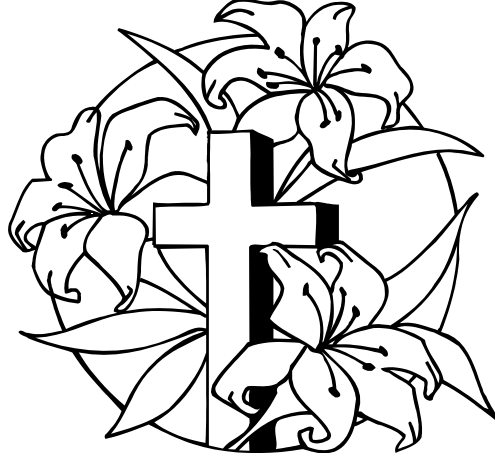
April 2016 Confernece
