Threads of Love arrives in Tampa to support NICU families an ABC Action News report 6/13/03

TAMPA - A group of local volunteers who sew clothes and blankets for premature babies made their first delivery Friday at St. Joseph's Women's Hospital. Their 'Threads of Love' are meant to help families in their time of need.



Little Connor Dunaway may be leaving St. Joe's neonatal intensive care unit in a couple of weeks, but it has been six months of a roller coaster ride for survival

"We've had a few incidences where we spent the night here because they didn't think he was going to make it," his mother, Mandy, recalled.

It is families like the Dunaways, living in the NICU, that can use some compassion and a helping hand.

Enter Threads of Love, a Christian volunteer organization making clothes, dolls, and blankets for premature babies nationwide. The ladies are with Tampa's first chapter, which operates locally through Grace Family Church. Connor is their first recipient.

"At first he was very small and we didn't have clothes that fit him, and they're hard to find," Dunaway continued.

Threads of Love also makes burial clothing for families who recently lost a baby, and they make keepsake envelopes so families can take special memories home and



mom even when she cannot be there.

I then prayed if I should go out to church to get he Bag and deliver it or have a secretary get it and have it available to be picked up. I felt led to go.

I went to the closet while Joe got the remembrance bags. Yesterday I had ordered books for \$200. When Joe came to the closet, he asked how much I had spent yesterday. He is my financial officer, so to speak, so he knew. I said, "\$200." He handed me a check of donations for \$202.40. Praise the Lord!!!!

A custodian kept hanging around. I ALWAYS thank them as they do so much for us. Well, he kept hanging around. I said, "Tell me what is going on with you." He took a deep breath and said, "Remember your birthday (TOL) party last September?" I nodded. "Well, after we set up I stayed behind and read your scrapbooks and looked at your pictures and all that you do." He was struggling not to cry. "I have been married 10 1/2 years and I have known my wife for 25 years. In her first marriage she had a baby who lived 6 1/2 hours. I was their friend so I helped bury him. He is buried right across the street." (in a cemetery there) "What you do for so many people is so overwhelming to me. You touch so many lives." I always quickly say, "To God be the glory!!!" The man, Joe and I were all so overwhelmed. I asked if he would accept a Remembrance Bag for his wife. and he agreed. I had a boy one in my hand and when I asked if the baby was a boy or a girl, of course it was a boy. To God be the glory! I pray this account will encourage each on of you to keep on keeping on.
