## **Our newest Chapters**

These are pictures of a shower a new chapter had. Below is a little bit of what they did and on the next page is the invitation. We have also had a shower in San Jose, and it was very effective. It is a great way to raise money for materials. They are fun and it gets the ladies involved, even if just for that day.

We advertised the shower somewhat within the church. The email went out to roughly 700 women. We had a pretty decent turnout – about 15 showed. I also emailed every woman (and some men) I knew and asked that they do the same to invite them. (I've attached a copy of the invitation in case someone else would like to use it.)

If I were to do this again, I'd concentrate on making one thing during the shower. In our case, the lovie dolls won out. We set it up assembly style, so everyone had a job. Even those with little to no sewing experience could participate. We also hosted another lovie doll making party at my house, since we needed so many. That worked out well too.

Some women wanted to sew, so I had two machines already set up (a couple brought their own) so they could do that. I had some patterns already cut to make that run smoothly. I had one woman who wanted to cut patterns, and she knew how. So she cut patterns and made kits the entire time.

The key to doing multiple things is to ask people when they call or email to RSVP. It makes everything run smoother if you know what their talents are. Otherwise, stick to one thing and delegate.

Have a donations box on a table where people can drop gift cards or cash. I also pre-made several items and pinned them to a display board so people could see what they were making. Some people are visual learners, so the samples are extremely helpful.

Take extra empty boxes and bags to collect any tangible items like fabric, yarn, Ziploc bags, ribbon, etc. Have a sign in sheet there for people to give you contact information. You'll also want a sign out sheet for anyone who takes something home to work on.

I would also eliminate the food if you are planning on working. My crew ate virtually nothing. They wanted to get busy!! And it's hard to do both. So my advice would be to either eat and socialize or work. I took about 10 minutes at the beginning of the shower to give everyone the history of TOL and explain what I thought our vision and focus should be. I also asked for input and suggestions, because I was flying by the seat of my pants! Lol. We prayed, then we got to work.

And lastly, ask for help planning the shower. I was so fortunate that a friend made all the snacks. I made the punch, while the church provided water and coffee. Another lady who wanted to help (who didn't sew) offered to make items for the little gift bags we gave out. She also provided all the decorations. Then others brought plates, cups, etc.

I know I kind of jumped around, but I just kept thinking of things! Use as much or as little of this as you need, and let me know if I can fill in any blanks.

#### What to bring:

If you sew, bring your sewing machine. If you knit, crochet or embroider, bring your supplies. If you know how to cut a pattern, bring a pair of scissors. If you can press, bring an iron and ironing board. We will have patterns cut and ready to assemble, we will have fabric ready to be cut, and we will have garments ready to be embroidered. If you crochet, we will have blankets ready that will need edging, or you can crochet the whole thing. We will have some yarn available for knitted hats, booties and blankets. We will also have all the patterns. Because this is our first event, our supplies will be limited until we begin receiving donations.

We will have a sew-in at the shower for those who are interested. Or come and socialize with us and learn more about this newest ministry.


