Sissy did not have to have the surgery. Her eye had improved some. Let's pray that the next injection she gets improves it even more so she doesn't have to have the surgery at all.




From the Joyce Daniel chapter of Greensboro, GA.

Happy New Year 2013 Threads of Love Members!

I'm meditating this morning on John 17 in my beloved Amplified Version of the Bible and it is so rich in truth and encouragement as we begin another "year of our LORD." It's always helpful to take stock as we end one year and begin a new one, to gather as a family and talk with each other, gather around the table together, take pictures together, remember the year of blessings and trials, and enjoy the relationships we cherish. What a blessing to hear from friends and family around the world as we exchange letters and cards to bond together in continued fellowship and love!

Jesus Christ, the son of God, is talking to HIS Father in this chapter as He approaches the end of his 33 years of life on this Earth. It appears to be Jesus' review of His time on the Earth and committing Himself afresh and anew to His Father's Purpose...a sort of bonding as Father and Son. It reminds me of the model prayer spoken of in the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 6:9) by this same Jesus who instructs us to pray to "Our Father who is in heaven...." Jesus and I have the same Father! We are in the same family! That same one Jesus spoke to in John 17 is MY Father! Jesus is talking to the Father about the fact that He is about to complete the work that His Father sent Him here to do! (verse 4) and then He says something very interesting in verse 5. "And now, Father, glorify Me along with Yourself and restore Me to such majesty and honor in Your presence as I had with You BEFORE THE WORLD EXISTED!" Jesus is the Eternal Son of God the Father! They were together from Eternity past to Eternity future. In verse 3 Jesus is describing what Eternal life is: "And this is eternal life: (it means) to know (to perceive, recognize, become acquainted with, and understand) YOU, the only true and real God, and (likewise) to know Him, Jesus (as the) Christ (the anointed One, the Messiah), Whom You have sent."

This eternal life is going on TODAY in 2013 and Jesus came to this Earth to give this life to "all whom You have given Him" (verse 2). Jesus is rehearsing to our Father that He is about to finish the work He was given to do. Let us realize that Jesus' sacrifice on the Cross 2013 years ago, and His shed blood for our sins, has provided ETERNAL LIFE for us...to know and become acquainted with the ONE TRUE GOD and His Son Jesus Christ the Righteous ONE. Let's glorify Him all year long by sharing Him with all those we come into contact with and let's be about the business of completing the work He has given us to do!
