

Just wanted to share our latest good news. My group (Heart of Texas Chapter) has just recently crossed a milestone of delivering the ten thousandth handmade item! We were honored with a lovely appreciation luncheon last Tuesday by the St. David's Round Rock Medical Center NICU, and their Volunteer Group made a \$500 donation to our operating fund.

In August I looked at the last year's budget and expenses and had set my budget for \$3600, or \$300 a month for the next 12 months, starting in September. I had no idea where or how I would get this amount of money, but I was certain that the Lord would provide. Only a few days had passed when I received word that our largest benefactor for the last four years had increased their donation to \$2000 a year. A few days later another greater supporter from Walmart sent word he had submitted a request for twice his last donation and was approved and we got \$1000 there. We received another annual donation of \$300 from my husband his partners at Mr. T. This week my nephew Chase sent 10% of his summer earnings which was His parents matched that with \$50, bringing us to \$3900 in donations in the last 60 days. To God be the Glory!

SEWING TIP

Next time you need to trim away a seam allowance let your serger do the work for you. This works particularly well on interfacing which needs to be trimmed before it is applied to a facing. Remove the needles from the serger. Measure the amount needed to be trimmed from the edge of the knife blade to determine which guide mark to use. Run the fabric through the machine and trim off the extra seam allowance.
