Sitter or Server?

"Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ." Galatians 6:2

ow would you answer this question – are you a sitter or a server? I attended a revival a few weeks ago and that was the subject of the message. It's a good question to all Christians. Are you doing something that shows the love of Christ or do you just attend church and have become a pew warmer?

In Galatians we are instructed to carry each others burdens, which has been the purpose of Threads of Love for almost sixteen years now. We can't change what happens to all those precious babies and their family, but we can and have made a difference in support of them. From the stories that I have received, each tells of how those stitches of love have shown the love and how it helped to carry that family's burden of dealing with the loss of an infant or a sick, premature baby. It must gladden the Lord's heart each time He looks down and sees the effect that those stitches of love have on those families.

"Do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with My righteous right hand." Isaiah 41:10

There are other organizations out there that are meeting the physical needs of these families but not the spiritual need. We don't know if the families that receive our gifts of love are Christians or not, but as a Christian, I would think in such a situation we would do one of two things: Run to the Lord and ask to be carried though this difficult time; or get mad at God and say "How did you let this happen." Through our prayers and the love that is sewn into each of the item that has been donated by Threads of Love, not only have we met the physical need, but our clothes are the vehicle by which we reach those families who are hurting and afraid. We want to be there to remind them that God is always there and will never forsake them at anytime. If they have not received the gift of salvation, then maybe through our gifts showing the love of Christ, they too will reach out and accept Him and receive the gift of salvation.

As most of you know Threads of Love started in September of 1993, it was not until September of 1997 that we started adding labels to our stitches of love. With the help of each of you we have passed a milestone of a million items donated; we are now at over 1,016,000 items that have been made and donated from donations and by volunteers.



There are 100 Threads of Love chapters sprinkled throughout the US, with three internationally located. Threads of Love donates handmade items to local

hospitals to distribute to the Labor & Delivery, ER, and NICU departments. Families of preemies receive these items as a comfort aid in a time of uncertainty.

GOD'S ACCURACY

How lovely to think about the way our Creator God planned everything so carefully and perfectly, everything with a plan. As His highest creation, 'we are fearfully and wonderfully made.'

> God's accuracy may be observed in the hatching of eggs. For example:

> The eggs of the potato bug hatch in 7 days; Those of the canary in 14 days; Those of the barnyard hen in 21 days. The eggs of ducks and geese hatch in 28 days; Those of the mallard in 35 days. The eggs of the parrot and the ostrich hatch in 42 days. (Notice, they are all divisible by seven).

God's wisdom is seen in the making of an elephant. The four legs of this great beast all bend forward in the same direction. No other Quadruped is so made. God planned that this animal would have a huge body, too large to live on two legs. For this reason He gave it four fulcrums so that it can rise from the ground easily.

> The horse rises from the ground on its two front legs first. A cow rises from the ground with its two hind legs first.

How wise the Lord is in all His works of creation! God's wisdom is revealed in His arrangement of sections and segments, as well as in the number of grains.

> Each watermelon has an even number of stripes on the rind.. Each orange has an even number of segments. Each ear of corn has an even number of rows. Each stalk of wheat has an even number of grains.

Every bunch of bananas has on its lowest row an even number of bananas, and each row decreases by one, so that one row has an even number and the next row an odd number.

The waves of the sea roll in on shore twenty-six to the minute in all kinds of weather.

All grains are found in even numbers on the stalks

The Lord specified thirty fold, sixty fold, and a hundredfold - all even Numbers.

God has caused the flowers to blossom at certain specified times during the day, so that Linnaeus, the great botanist, once said that if he had a conservatory containing the right kind of soil. moisture and temperature, he could tell the time of day or night by the flowers that were open and those that were closed!

Thus the Lord in His wonderful grace can arrange the life that is entrusted to His care in such a way that it will carry out His purposes and plans, and will be fragrant with His presence. Only the God-planned life is successful.

Only the life given over to the care of the Lord is safe.
