
Our Idea Table which, replaces the Best Dress, we hope will be very informative to all.


Congratulations for not only being the first chapter but also the oldest with 20 years of servicing the needs of God's Littlest Angels

Sewing hints.

- -As you turn your iron on and pour water in for it to steam, be sure to slide it over a cloth, etc. to be sure there is no residue on the plate that will transfer to your garment.
- -Keep a Sticky Roller in your sewing room to "clean" your ironing board, etc. of little cut ends, etc.
- -An EZ way to sew on 2 or 4 eye buttons is to drop your feed dogs, tape the button on the garment, place it under the presser foot, lower the foot, and zig zag in place over the button holes.
- -Binder clips come in all sizes and are great to use to hold fabric or binding in place or out of the way as you sew/embroider.
