Sissy received an email from Kim Roemer, a nurse at Ascension Sacred Heart Emeral Coast Hospital requesting assistance from TOL. Sissy then called me to find out how close this hospital was to me. It's only about 30 miles. She asked if I would follow up with her. I did and found out they needed internment gowns. They also have a NICU and needed preemie bundles. Our preemie bundles include a knitted hat, vest, crocheted blanket, and a Lovie doll. I had some preemie bundles on hand but no gowns. In the meantime a lady from a TOL chapter in Georgia called Sissy and said she had some internment gowns If anybody needed any. Sissy put her in touch with me and I got them in the mail in just a few days. With all these in hand I delivered these to the nurse that contacted Sissy. So now our Panama City Beach chapter serves 2 hospitals! We are in our 2nd year of existence and God has blessed us in so many ways. From this testimony you can see how He has directed my path!

#### CREATING A CULTURE OF MISSIONS BECOME A MISSION'S MINDED TEAM SPREADING THE CULTURE – THREADS OF LOVE

Established in October 2016, Threads of Love For Heaven's Sake is a faith based nationally known organization dedicated to providing clothing and care items for premature babies (living and deceased). This amazing branch, from Community Bible Church (CBC) in San Antonio, is an outreach ministry made up of men and women volunteers. Items are handmade and distributed to local San Antonio hospitals, Neonatal Intensive Care Units (NICU), and a hospital in Corpus Christi They also support Eden's Song Ministry with handmade sock dolls which hold the parents smell to comfort baby, baby blankets, newborn outfits and preemie outfits. The beautiful items for deceased babies are sent to our missionaries with birthing centers to support parents in their loss & for the burial ceremony.

Threads of Love is essential to many organizations, including Eden's Song, & we are blessed they partner with our Midwife kit project.

Years before deciding to be involved with Threads of Love (TOL), I read a story about the ministry and was impressed with the amount of love and expertise involved with the work. I felt a nudge in my heart, but at the time I was working full time, my children were young, my husband and I taught Sunday School together, etc. Although I wanted to be a part of TOL, I felt over committed with other responsibilities and put my thoughts about it on a back burner.

As the years passed, I occasionally thought of TOL but I wasn't ready to make another commitment. I now know God was gently preparing me for the calling and would later direct me more specifically. Threads of Love would become a ministry not only for me but also my husband, and the chapter would blossom into an outreach ministry to our community.

Fast forward with me to August 2016. I began thinking of retirement from my full-time job as a flight attendant, wondering what I would do with my extra time. Whatever I did, I wanted the work to be God directed and to help others, while giving back to my community. As I self-reflected, memories of losing my first baby to an early miscarriage, and my daughter losing triplets in 2014, pushed TOL back to the forefront of my mind. My thoughts and admiration for the work of TOL was and is God calling me to work for Him, in a way I could never have imagined.

I began talking to my husband repeatedly about TOL, and the possibility of getting involved in a local chapter. It was only after my husband finally said to me, "either do something or quit talking about it", which spurred me to action. To be completely honest with you, it was the jolt I needed to set me on the path to move and "do something about it". But how would I balance my work and this ministry?

God is always in the details when what you are doing is for Him **Romans 8:31** *"What shall we then say to these things? If God be for us, who can be against us?" KJV* 

I continued working 4 more years after starting Threads of Love For Heavens Sake...it can be done even when you have a full-time job! Next, I checked with my church to find if they had space available for our chapter. It also had to be on a day of the week I could be available. Thankfully, we were able to reserve a large space at church on a day fitting perfectly into our schedule. Now, will anyone come?

In September 2016, through our church online media, we invited the entire 21,000-member church to attend what we called: See and Share, to learn about TOL in a little more detail. We borrowed display items from other Threads of Love chapters, as it seemed important to us for those attending to see sample items of what we do. It had a tangible effect and helped attendees better understand what we would be making for babies, hospitals, neonatal ICU, nurses and families. Thirteen ladies and one gentleman attended; we were so excited!

Threads of Love For Heavens Sake is in the 5<sup>th</sup> year of ministry and going strong, with a volunteer base of 65 members. Volunteers come as their schedules allow. When they can't attend gatherings, most volunteers come and drop off finished items, pick-up cut fabrics, yarn, socks for Lovie Dolls or other materials to work at home.

- Contact Sissy Davis <u>first</u>. (As the TOL founder, she will give you valuable information and pointers.) You'll receive a new handbook; it will serve you well.
- Follow the few easy steps Sissy will give you to get started. Signing up as a registered chapter was easy.
- If you have access to another TOL Chapter, it may be helpful to ask a member or leader to attend your first orientation/gathering.
- Invite everyone! If you use church facilities, invite people not attending any church. It's a great outreach program. And don't be concerned about inviting other church's members too, God uses all His children.
- We allow volunteers to pick the items they enjoy making. We follow TOL guidelines and, if needed, contact a NICU nurse for direction. (We have a small board of nurse advisers).
- Our chapter began growing and the need with finances grew too. One of our members volunteered to file for tax exemption, allowing us to become a non-profit organization.
- Accept all help and listen to suggestions! We contacted organizations offering grants, filled out applications (it is work but rewarding)
- A generous businessman and his wife (a retired NICU nurse) love Threads of Love and volunteered to finance a website. The couple hired a professional to design and construct our website.
- Remember, chapters evolve and grow over time. If you're interested in starting a chapter, talk to your friends. You'll be surprised at the responses. Many will become members.
- Trust yourself to lead. Every chapter has a different story, was started in a different way and for different reasons.
- Our chapter has a devotion each gathering. Members are invited to bring a snack or lunch to enjoy during the devotion. We sometimes have guest speakers during devotions such as pastors, nurses, teachers, mothers and grandmothers. Many have lost a baby or have a child who survived a premature birth and want to talk about their experiences. "Variety is the spice of life" so keep thinking outside the box.
- You will experience bumps in the road, don't be discouraged, stay with it. Next to your own family it will bring you the greatest rewards you'll ever receive. Believe this: "If God is for you who can be against you".
